 - As your role as a future manager, which perspective would you take? Which position? How does this differ between your abstract answer (question 1) and your personal answer (question 2).
- Case question: You need to make a manual for a company on how to negatiate a salary during a recruiting or promotion interview.
 - Write the manual you would give to the managers
 - Your friend wants to apply for a job in that company. Based on your manual, what advice would you give?
- Self-reflection question: the red sneakers effect has 4 boundary conditions. In these conditions, non-conforming will lead to a perceived higher status.
 - The red sneakers effect is an example of reverse-causality. Explain.
 - Give 2 boundary conditions and explain what insights they brought you towards your future career.
 - o Will this effect work equally well if somebody from racial minorities does this?
